

Junior School Assessment Guidelines for Year 10 RE

September - June

Year 10: September - December

Course Overview: The Death and Resurrection of Jesus and consideration of who we are as individuals.

- **Project:** Students will compile a detailed report about the crucifixion of Jesus from a bystander's point of view. This project will be marked out of 20 marks.
- **Continuous Assessment:** Students will be assessed on 4 specified homeworks each term and this will have a total of 20 marks.
- **Christmas Exam:** Students will be assessed on the knowledge and skills they have developed in their study of The Death and Resurrection and research into who we are as individuals. This will include:
 - Keywords and their meanings
 - Knowledge of key events during the death and resurrection of Jesus
 - Knowledge of what makes us unique and how we develop as a person.
 - An extended piece of writing on a key question.

Year 10: January – June

Course Overview: Jackie Pullinger, the Reformation and World Religions.

- **Project:** Students will carry out research to complete a presentation on amnesty international and present their findings to the class. This project will be marked out of 20 marks.
- **Continuous Assessment:** Students will be assessed on 4 specified homeworks each term and this will have a total of 20 marks.
- **Summer Exam:** Students will be assessed on the knowledge and skills they have developed during their year 10 course. This will include:
 - Keywords and their meanings
 - Knowledge of the background to Jackie Pullinger and her work in Hong Kong.
 - Knowledge of The Reformation and the part Martin Luther played in the events of the Reformation.
 - Knowledge and understanding of the main teachings and symbolisms in Judaism and Islam.
 - An extended piece of writing on key questions.
